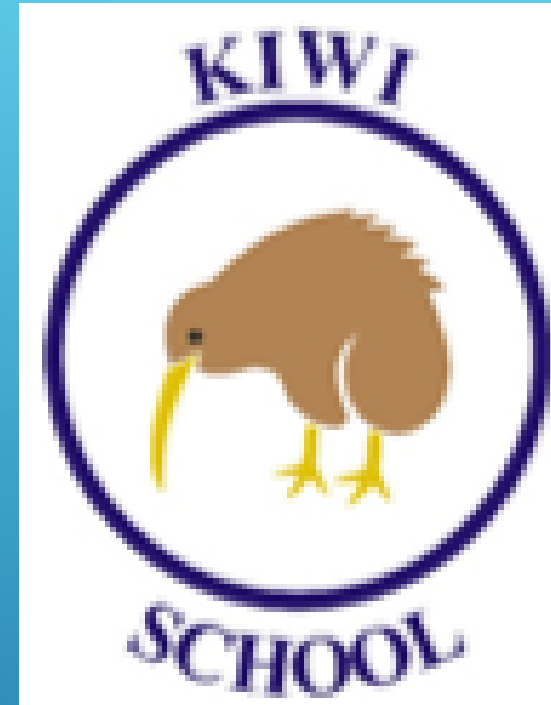

BRITISH VALUES

British Values

Democracy
We know that everyone has rights and responsibilities.

Tolerance
We know the freedom to make choices about what to do and how to do it is a basic part of our lives.

We have the freedom to make choices about what to do and how to do it.

Parliament
This is a place where people meet to discuss and decide on the laws of the country.

Faith
This is a strong belief when it is related to a religion.

We can make our own choices in school.

Individual Liberty

We know, understand and exercise our rights and personal freedoms safely.

We enjoy learning about different faiths and cultures from around the world.

Culture
This is the way of life of a particular group of people, including their language, customs and beliefs.

Democracy

We vote for who represents us on the School Council.

We have the freedom to make choices about choosing the level of challenge in some lessons.

We have the freedom to make choices about joining extra-curricular clubs.

We help to decide which charities we would like to raise money for.

We have a say in what happens in our school.

Members of different faiths are welcome in our school and are encouraged to share their knowledge with us.

Tolerance of those of different Faiths and Beliefs

We enjoy visiting and learning about places of worship from different faiths.

We understand the consequences of breaking laws and rules.

We help develop self rules for our class and school.

We know that our behaviour affects our rights and the rights of others.

Respect
This means treating others the way you would like to be treated. It means being kind and helpful to others and respecting their rights and beliefs.

We promote diversity through celebration of different faiths and beliefs.

We understand how prejudice can lead to hate and how important it is to overcome prejudice.

Community Cohesion

We work together to help one another.

We know that we are part of a culturally diverse society and have opportunities to experience different cultures.

We use opportunities such as The Olympics and the World Cup to learn about different cultures.

The Rule of Law

We understand how laws are made in parliament.

Enrichment activities are important for the children's personal development because they:

- ▶ Help children develop their interests and talents.
- ▶ Enable children to develop their character, including resilience, confidence and independence.
- ▶ Teach children how to keep physically and mentally healthy.
- ▶ Prepare them for future success.

ENRICHMENT ACTIVITIES AND EXPERIENCES

- ▶ School trips including a residential for our older pupils
- ▶ Visitors to school, including sports people, artists, authors and musicians
- ▶ Performances in school such as plays and concerts
- ▶ Workshops focused on topics the children may be learning
- ▶ Extracurricular activities from outside providers such as Southampton Sports and Ukelele lessons
- ▶ Enrichment theme days/weeks such as Anti-bullying, internet safety, Christmas Around the World

WHAT ENRICHMENT ACTIVITIES DO WE PROVIDE AT KIWI PRIMARY?

- ▶ Starting on Thursday next week, we are really excited to be able to provide some new enrichment activities for the children in the form of clubs. Clubs will be available to children in Years 1 to 6 and will be run across one or two year groups. The activities provided in these clubs will change every half term so that children experience a range of activities across the year.

WHAT ENRICHMENT ACTIVITIES DO WE
PROVIDE AT KIWI PRIMARY?

For this term, the following clubs will be available:

- ▶ Y1/2 – construction club, film club & colouring club
- ▶ Y3 – lego club & boomwhacker club
- ▶ Y4 – art club & drawing club
- ▶ Y5/6 – film club, comic or chess club & book club

Your child will be able to choose which one they would like to do from the options available for their Year Group

WHAT ENRICHMENT ACTIVITIES DO WE PROVIDE AT KIWI PRIMARY?
