## TAKE ONE WORLD



#### LITERACY

As writers, the children will be given the opportunity to write in a variety of genres in both fiction and nonfiction. This will include narrative with a focus on character description, a persuasive text linked to our Geography topic of 'The Alps' and poetry to celebrate national poetry day. Our key text for this term is 'Wonder' by RJ Palacio.

Alongside this, the children will continue to learn comprehension, spelling and grammar skills. All of these skills will be consolidated and embedded throughout the curriculum.

### **SCIENCE**

As scientists, children will explore living things in their habitats, developing their understanding of the life cycles of plants and animals. The children will also develop their knowledge and understanding of predictions and conclusions.

## **COMPUTING**

In computing, the children will be focusing on E-Safety. The children will agree class internet rules based on personal responsibilities and look at strategies to prevent cyber bullying.

## <u>MFL</u>

This term, the children will continue to develop their French conversational skills from Year 4 and will begin to construct simple sentences.

#### **MATHEMATICS**

As mathematicians, children will continue to learn how to apply place value to areas such as partitioning, rounding, Roman Numerals and reasoning skills. They will be looking at addition and subtraction, multiplication and division using written and mental methods and applying these in different context.
