



Physical Education (PE) Curriculum Intent, Implementation and Impact.

Intent

Kiwi Primary School believes that Physical Education (PE), experienced in a safe and supportive environment, is essential to ensure children attain optimum physical and emotional development and good health. We intend to deliver high-quality teaching and learning opportunities that inspire all children to succeed in physical education and in developing life skills. We want to teach children skills to keep them safe such as being able to swim. We also want to teach children how to cooperate and collaborate with others as part of an effective team, understanding fairness and equity of play to embed life-long values. Our curriculum aims to improve the wellbeing and fitness of all children at Kiwi Primary School, not only through the sporting skills taught, but through the underpinning values and disciplines PE promotes.

Implementation

- PE at Kiwi Primary School provides challenging and enjoyable learning through a range of sporting activities including; invasion games, net & wall games, strike and field games, gymnastics, dance, swimming and outdoor & adventure.
- The long-term plan sets out the PE units which are to be taught throughout the year. We use the peplanning.org.uk curriculum, this ensures that the requirements of the National Curriculum are fully met.
- EYFS and KS 1 Pupils participate in one high quality PE lesson each week, covering a different discipline each term. KS2 Pupils participate in two high quality PE lessons each week, covering two sporting disciplines every half term.
- An after-school sport club is provided by Southampton twice a week one night for EYFS/KS1 and one night for KS2.
- This year we aim to participate in competitive sporting events within the local area including but not limited to the Salisbury School's Mini Marathon and competitive matches against other local schools. This is an inclusive approach which endeavours to encourage not only physical development but also mental well-being. These events also develop teamwork and leadership skills and are very much enjoyed by the children.
- Each year a small group of Year 6 children are invited to become Play Leaders for the school. They develop into role models for the younger children, assisting with lunch-time play and our annual Sports day.
- Children participate in workshops covering a variety of sports throughout the year. For example, African Dancing, Rock Climbing and Cricket again providing the children with an opportunity to develop, improve their fitness and to try something new.
- Children in Year 5 and 6 have swimming lesson. Each Class swims for a half term at the local swimming pool and are taught by qualified swimming teachers who are also members of Kiwi staff.

Impact

We help motivate children to participate in a variety of sports through quality teaching that is engaging and fun. From our lessons, our children learn to take responsibility for their own health and fitness, many of whom also enjoy the success of competitive sports. We equip our children with the necessary skills and a love for sport. They will hopefully grow up to live happy and healthy lives utilising the skills and knowledge acquired through PE.
